Greetings: The good name of the Goldman School of Public Policy specifically and the University of California Berkeley generally are being tarnished by GSSP endorsement of and association with Michael Peevey, the disgraced former President of the California Public Utilities Commission. Peevey's actions are inconsistent with the most fundamental principle upon which effective public policy rests, integrity. Instead of careful development of data, precise evaluation of options, and persuasive methods of implementation Peevey stands publicly for manipulation and strong arm tactics. He does not believe nor does he feign to even practice public

policy based on reason and the public good.

While at the California Public Utilities Commission, Peevey engaged in personal corruption but he also corrupted those around him and the system within whichhe worked. Peevey has spread the contagion of corruption to GSPP by making it appear that GSPP is standing up and speaking up for him in the face of overwhelming evidence he disgraced the office of President of the California Public Utilities Commission. Under Peevey the CPUC coveredup investigations into three horrific safety accidents caused by California's major public utilities, the 2007 SDG&E equipment-caused fires in San Diego, the 2010 PG&E gas line explosion in San Bruno, and the 2010 Edison steam generator failures at San Onofre. What sparked Peevey to lose it was a question about whether he had concocted a secret deal with Southern California Edison to stop the investigation into whether Edison has acted unreasonably in deploying the defective steam generators at San Onofre that caused the plant to shut down and burden ratepayers with \$5 billion in charges for electricity they will never receive. The inventory from a search warrant executed on Peevey last week showed notes from such a secret meeting Peevey had with Edison Senior Vice President and General Counsel Stephen Pickett at the Hotel Bristol in Warsaw, Poland. As a University of California, Berkeley alumnus, I write asking why your school would be affiliated with an event honoring former California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) president Michael Peevey. He is at the center of multiple, converging scandals surrounding the natural gas explosion in San Bruno that killed eight of my constituents and the shutdown of the San Onofre nuclear plant in Southern California. These scandals have led the state's Attorney General to raid his home in La Cañada/Flintridge and caused the U.S. attorney's office to open an investigation into his potentially illegal actions.

Accepting money from an event honoring Michael Peevey sends the wrong message to your students and alumni. How would it look should the entities donating money or purchasing tables at the fundraising event end up being the very utilities that have coopted the CPUC under Peevey's watch, allegedly through improper means?

You may not be aware of the extent to which Peevey has forfeited the public trust. Since the 2010 explosion in San Bruno, more than 30 editorials from newspapers around the state heavily criticized the CPUC under Peevey, including more than 15 that have called for his resignation or removal. These editorials were published even before emails emerged that suggest that Peevey traded ratepayer money for contributions to ballot campaigns and the non-profit foundation he controlled.

Indeed, the reason it would be a good case is that it is complex and the simple reflex response of "run away from people who are under investigation" needs to be balanced with many other important considerations. It was, however, the combination of shrewdness and power that proved to be his Achilles heal. Never a humble man, Mr. Peevey in my opinion grew arrogant over time and saw his role more as "benevolent dictator" than as consensus builder. As you know, there really is no such thing as a "benevolent dictator;" whether one agrees with this person's vision of the public interest, no one person should be given such power without checks and balances. Essentially, Mr. Peevey determined that his views of the public interest were, in fact, the public interest, and he had the ability and will to implement these views. This is a recipe for corruption and not surprisingly led to a disregard of fair process, a lack of concern of public perception, a cast of sycophants, and an air of untouchability. In this light, it is not surprising that, in our pluralistic society with a freewheeling media (and a set of laws and rules which are supposed to be binding), Mr. Peevey has fallen from grace. His vision, talents and stature notwithstanding, this was inevitable.

As Chief Judge at the CPUC, I have observed this drama up close. I know all of the participants in the "judgeshopping" and "ex parte rules" controversies (whether by good fortune or my ethics, I am untouched by any hint of scandal!). My organization is badly damaged by these events. I personally am working with the new CPUC President (Michael Picker) to both articulate a new vision of ethical behavior and to institute culture change, rule/law changes and CPUC sanctions for wrong-doing both internally and externally (investigations of criminality are of course handled by law enforcement agencies). This process is wrenching, time-consuming and somewhat Sisyphean (i.e, we will never be perfect).

Regarding Mr. Peevey and the Goldman School, I fully understand why the long-standing relationship between the School and Mr. Peevey is important and should not be lightly tossed away. Mr. Peevey surely has been an excellent source of funds, beneficial relationships and intellectual leadership. It's worse than inexplicable that the UIt's worse than inexplicable that the UC Berkeley Goldman School of Public Policy would associate itself with, let alone benefit from, an event honoring former state Public Utilities Commission President Michael Peevey.

In fact, it is shameful.

Henry Brady, the school's dean, noted last week that Peevey had a long record of public service and the school liked to honor "public servants who have taken on tough issues."

Yes, the 76-year-old Peevey is widely and correctly credited with promoting green energy and helping steer California out of an energy crisis.

But a less noble portrait of Peevey has emerged as the media spotlight has focused on the commission after the disastrous September 2010 explosion of a Pacific, Gas and Electric Co. natural gas pipeline in San Bruno. Peevey's coziness with the utility, as underscored in a trove of recently released e-mails, is at best unseemly and an affront to the public that counts on the commission as a watchdog over rates and safety.

And the story of Peevey's "public service" is far from complete.

State agents searched Peevey's Los Angeles County home last month looking for evidence of bribery, influence peddling and other felony conduct at the state PUC.

"Accepting money from an event honoring Michael Peevey sends the wrong message to your students and alumni," state Sen. Jerry Hill, a San Mateo Democrat who has been pushing to reform the commission, wrote to Brady about the \$250-a-plate fundraiser.

It suggests the school is either out of touch with what is happening in the real world, oblivious to the concept of "good public policy," or so desperate for money that it doesn't mind being used by people who are determined to alter the narrative of a former regulator who is under fire.

"Accepting money from an event honoring Michael Peevey sends the wrong message to your students and alumni," state Sen. Jerry Hill, a San Mateo Democrat who has been pushing to reform the commission, wrote to Brady about the \$250-a-plate fundraiser.

It suggests the school is either out of touch with what is happening in the real world, oblivious to the concept of "good public policy," or so desperate for money that it doesn't mind being used by people who are determined to alter the narrative of a former regulator who is under fire.

I was dismayed to read the Chronicle's Feb 17 op-ed that used the occasion of a retirement dinner for Michael Peevey, former head of the California Public Utility Commission, to tarnish the reputation of the Goldman School of Public Policy.

The event in question was a private dinner, put on by friends of Michael Peevey to honor proven record of commitment sustainable energy. The event was not designed as a fundraiser. I just returned to my office and there was a message from an *LA Times* reporter asking what I will be doing with the about \$55,000 from the event. (I don't know if this figure is correct since I haven't talked with the event organizers.) On the advice of Claire Holmes, I have not been responding to such requests. (I've had several others).

<u>To recap:</u>

Issue: A few months ago I indicated that GSPP would be happy to receive any "excess" funds from a tribute dinner for Michael Peevey, former head of the California Public Utilities Commission. After that, a story broke indicating that Mr. Peevey's computers and personal papers had been seized by a state investigative unit. Subsequent stories indicated that he might have been involved in unethical behavior according to state guidelines and even in a "judge shopping" effort on the part of a utility company. There have been no indictments.

Just so you know, Mr. Peevey has been a generous contributor to Cal including a chair in the Economics department, and he has been on my Advisory Board for many years. His wife is State Senator Carol Liu.

Several newspapers have run editorials saying that I should reject the money from the Peevey event. I've enclosed the one from the *SF Chronicle*. The *San Jose Mercury News* and the *Contra Costa Times* also had similar editorials.

Two Specific Issues:

- What should be done about the money?
- How should we deal with Mr. Peevey's position on the GSPP advisory board?

Options with respect to the money:

- (1) Stand pat and take the money and let the storm pass
- (2) Hope that the organizers will see the light and decide to give the proceeds to another charity (and not stand in the way of them doing this if they so desires)
- (3) Openly reject the donation.

Note that GSPP did not organize the event and Mr. Peevey did not organize the event. It was organized by Susan Kennedy (former chief of staff for Governor Schwarzenegger) and Don Solem (a public relations specialist, I think). Just before the event ten days ago I wrote the following to many news reporters which includes e-mails (which I had solicited) from the two organizers:

Hence, I believe that we are quite "arms-length" from this event and from Mr. Peevey, but obviously the newspapers see it differently. I also believe that people are innocent until proven guilty, and that loyalty is an important virtue. I have tried to be loyal to Mr. Peevey.

Options with Respect to Mr. Peevey's Position on the Advisory Board

- (1) Stand pat and let the storm pass no matter what
- (2) Be ready to ask him to resign if he is indicted.
- (3) Be ready to ask him to resign if convicted.

It would be great to have some guidance on how you and the Chancellor would like me to handle this. I worry that although the current storm has mostly passed, there are many forces and perhaps events to come that will create a stir.

As I said above, I value loyalty very, very highly and I value "innocent until proven guilty." Still, I would also like to protect the Goldman School and UC Berkeley.

One further thing: President Napolitano will be the speaker at our next Advisory Board Meeting April 16th.

Chronicle Editorial

It's worse than inexplicable that the UC Berkeley Goldman School of Public Policy would associate itself with, let alone benefit from, an event honoring former state Public Utilities Commission President Michael Peevey.

In fact, it is shameful.

Henry Brady, the school's dean, noted last week that Peevey had a long record of public service and the school liked to honor "public servants who have taken on tough issues."

Yes, the 76-year-old Peevey is widely and correctly credited with promoting green energy and helping steer California out of an energy crisis.

But a less noble portrait of Peevey has emerged as the media spotlight has focused on the commission after the disastrous September 2010 explosion of a Pacific, Gas and Electric Co. natural gas pipeline in San Bruno. Peevey's coziness with the utility, as underscored in a trove of recently released e-mails, is at best unseemly and an affront to the public that counts on the commission as a watchdog over rates and safety.

And the story of Peevey's "public service" is far from complete.

State agents searched Peevey's Los Angeles County home last month looking for evidence of bribery, influence peddling and other felony conduct at the state PUC.

"Accepting money from an event honoring Michael Peevey sends the wrong message to your students and alumni," state Sen. Jerry Hill, a San Mateo Democrat who has been pushing to reform the commission, wrote to Brady about the \$250-a-plate fundraiser.

It suggests the school is either out of touch with what is happening in the real world, oblivious to the concept of "good public policy," or so desperate for money that it doesn't mind being used by people who are determined to alter the narrative of a former regulator who is under fire.

It's worse than inexplicable that the UIt's worse than inexplicable that the UC Berkeley Goldman School of Public Policy would associate itself with, let alone benefit from, an event honoring former state Public Utilities Commission President Michael Peevey.

In fact, it is shameful.

Henry Brady, the school's dean, noted last week that Peevey had a long record of public service and the school liked to honor "public servants who have taken on tough issues."

Yes, the 76-year-old Peevey is widely and correctly credited with promoting green energy and helping steer California out of an energy crisis.

But a less noble portrait of Peevey has emerged as the media spotlight has focused on the commission after the disastrous September 2010 explosion of a Pacific, Gas and Electric Co. natural gas pipeline in San Bruno. Peevey's coziness with the utility, as underscored in a trove of recently released e-mails, is at best unseemly and an affront to the public that counts on the commission as a watchdog over rates and safety.

And the story of Peevey's "public service" is far from complete.

State agents searched Peevey's Los Angeles County home last month looking for evidence of bribery, influence peddling and other felony conduct at the state PUC.

"Accepting money from an event honoring Michael Peevey sends the wrong message to your students and alumni," state Sen. Jerry Hill, a San Mateo Democrat who has been pushing to reform the commission, wrote to Brady about the \$250-a-plate fundraiser.

It suggests the school is either out of touch with what is happening in the real world, oblivious to the concept of "good public policy," or so desperate for money that it doesn't mind being used by people who are determined to alter the narrative of a former regulator who is under fire.



Editorial on UC is off base

The Times editorial, "Cal program should return tainted money," regarding the UC Berkeley's Goldman School of Public Policy accepting a gift from former PUC President Michael Peevey is totally off base. The university should not be chastised because a benefactor might have committed unethical acts.

Taking your editorial to its logical conclusion, no university should accept money from anyone who might have "crossed ethical lines." If that were the case, many prominent universities, including Stanford, would not exist. Its founder, Leland Stanford, was a noted robber baron, who participated in the worst practices of the Gilded Age -- stock watering, kickbacks, rebates, bribes, collusion, monopoly -- all examples of unethical behavior. The answers to these questions, even from a die-hard Cal Bear's fan, is "no." That would be ridiculous. And unfortunately, so is your criticism of UC Berkeley accepting money from Peevey's retirement dinner, especially since the money can be used for so many worthwhile purposes.

Peevey Toasters Face Public Scrutiny

Southern California Edison implicates Peevey in Unethical Warsaw Meeting, Violating Rules, Statutes, and Propriety

Attendees of Gala Event Tacitly Endorse Peevey Malfeasance

FEBRUARY 11, 2015 – Citizens' Oversight Projects (COPS) calls on citizens to put pressure on insiders who are planning to attend, sponsor, or accept funds from the planned "Peevey Gala Celebration," scheduled to occur at 6pm, February 12, 2015, at the Merchant Exchange Building in San Francisco. Michael Peevey is expresident of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC).

The official submission by Southern California Edison (SCE) on Monday outlined the improper and unethical meeting in Warsaw, Poland, between SCE and Peevey in 2013, apparently to concoct the bailout of SCE after the failure of the steam generators at the San Onofre Nuclear plant, finally disclosing the meeting 683 days late. The proper investigation of the near nuclear disaster at San Onofre was never completed, instead opting for the bailout settlement that Peevey and SCE executive Pickett likely outlined at this meeting on a Bristol Hotel notepad, confiscated recently in a raid on Peevey's home by the Attorney General's office.

Peevey is also implicated in the San Bruno gas explosion affair, which killed eight people and was to result in a multi-billion dollar penalty, and which was the primary impetus for the raids on the homes of Peevey, former CPUC Executive Director Paul Clannon, and former PG&E executive Brian Cherry.

"There is now no question," said Ray Lutz, of COPS. "People going to the gala event now must decide if they will stand against this sort of abuse, or if they will go along with the obvious power play by Peevey and his cronies."

Lutz said they would like to see the event canceled for lack of attendance.

COPS believes that we must hold public officials up to the highest of standards. Unlike every other state agency, there is no legal review by the Superior Courts of the actions of the CPUC. If they abuse their power, the only option we have as citizens is to make sure they leave their office in disgrace, and not toasted as heroes.

COPS plans to hold a press conference and "Prosecute Peevey" rally outside the event starting at 5pm on the 12th.

Lutz said he called the Henry Brady, Dean of The Goldman School of Public Policy at UC Berkeley, a sponsor and recipient of any surplus monies generated by the \$250 a plate affair. They do this in exchange for lending their untarnished name to the event. Lutz asked Brady not to accept money from the event and to pull their sponsorship. But Brady refused, saying he could see no conflict of interest. Since then, dean's office was swamped with 100s of phone calls, emails, and faxes, with no letup in sight.

"With the clear impropriety now outlined in writing by SCE, the support of this event by this UC school of public policy is beyond comprehension. I think Mr. Brady should retake Ethics 101, and the decision to support the gala event should be reviewed by Public Policy students, and also by the UC board of regents."

Lutz said the COPS activist network is relentless, and will go to the various donors of the school to make sure they are aware of the unethical support of this event by the school, and to pull future donations. It will become far too expensive to continue to support malfeasance than it will for the college to take the high road and distance itself from Peevey. "We will be documenting every person, organization, and elected official who attends this event and we will make sure the information comes to light, so their donors, benefactors, and voters know they are continuing to support unethical malfeasance and abuse of power. We as citizens must use our power to stop such waste, fraud and abuse through civic engagement, the mission of COPS.".
